



SPORTS BETTING 101



MONEYLINE BETS AND ODDS

If you bet on one team to win a game, you'll be making a Moneyline bet. For example, if you see -110 next to the team you like, you would need to bet \$110 to win \$100. In this example, a winning bet would net you a total of \$210. Your original \$110 plus the \$100 won.

If you see +125 this means that if you bet \$100 you will win \$125, netting you a total of \$225.

POINT SPREAD

If you bet on the Point Spread of a game, you are selecting which team may win or lose by a set number of points. For example, if you bet on a team at -3.5 you are betting that the team will win by 4 points or more. Conversely, if you bet on a team at +3.5 you are betting that the team will lose by 3 points or less, or win the game outright.

TOTALS (OVER/UNDER)

If you bet the total combined score of both teams to go over or under a certain number, you are placing a Totals bet. For example, you bet on a game to go over 48.5 points and the total combined score ends up being 50. In this case, you would win your over bet. Conversely, if you bet a game to go under 48.5 points and the total score ends up being 45, you would win your under bet.

PARLAY

A Parlay is a bet in which you combine 2 (or more) individual bets together into one single combined bet. If all individual bets in the parlay win, you win a larger return than if you had bet each game individually. However, if any single bet in the parlay loses, the entire parlay loses.
